Writing across comedy and drama, Dave is a screenwriter and playwright who enjoys dissecting the off-kilter aspects of the human condition – morally ambiguous characters traversing ethical minefields.

His Hampstead Theatre play *Experience* was shortlisted for the Nick Darke Award. Dave then adapted it into the feature film *Embers*, which was part of a BFI London Film Festival showcase, before being nominated for Best UK Feature at Raindance Film Festival. Dave has had several plays at the Edinburgh Festival, including *Somewhere Beneath*, winner of a Fringe First Award. His short plays have been produced at the Royal Court, Soho Theatre, and the Criterion, West End. He was longlisted for both the Channel 4 Screenwriting Course and the Bruntwood Prize for Playwriting, and his plays are published by Bloomsbury. His most recent play *The Gift* at Park Theatre received a host of four and five star reviews, and is being developed into a sitcom.

Dave is a BAFTA Connect Member, a BBC Voices and BBC Drama Room alumnus, and his comedy *Shock Jock* aired on Radio 4. His TV sitcom and drama pilots have been optioned by Hat Trick, LA Productions and Avalon; and he has developed projects with Red Productions, Rollem, Motif Pictures, DLT Entertainment, and Tiger Aspect. Dave's feature thriller *Sins In The Family* premiered on Lifetime/Paramount+.
