Guðni has taken part in Reykjavik International Film Festival Talent Lab, Cinekid Script Lab and Cinekid Co-production Market. Recently, he received development funding for a feature titled STUCK from Screen Scotland, production funding for a short film titled VESTIGE from BFI and development funding for a feature titled FABLED from The Icelandic Film Centre.

Dark comedy, 30 min episodes. A series following Eiríkur, a peasant in 17th century Iceland, and his attempts to use forbidden magic to improve his miserable life while being trodden upon by the government, the church and the country itself.

Sci-fi horror. 90mins. Directed by Joseph Simmons. Following the disappearance of his father, a troubled teenage is sent to visit his grandfather on a remote island. Adventure feature film about Icelandic folklore and magic. In development with Zik Zak Productions.

(writer)

Sci-fi horror feature film about trolls in the Icelandic highlands.

HERALD

(writer)

Sci-fi horror. Short film to be directed by Joseph Simmons. In a distant future, Mars is mined for its resources by humans. When an astronaut stumbles upon a cave full of living ore, his mind and body are changed forever. His discovery must be shared with the rest of humanity, by any means necessary.

GHILLIE DHU

(writer)

Dark comedy to be directed by Neill Prentice. Ghillie Dhu is a surreal dead-pan comedy set in the Scottish highlands, about a young man who must find and kill a mythical creature if he is to marry the girl he loves.

(writer)

Sci-fi horror. Short film funded by BFI and to be directed by Joseph Simmons. A young boy who has lost his father. An old man seeking a connection with his grandson. A supernatural discovery that might provide them both with the answers they crave. The film has played at a number of festivals including Frightfest and FilmQuest.

DONOR

(writer/director)

Thriller, 8 mins. A young woman awakes in an unfamiliar hospital after an unwanted surgery. Terrified and alone, she tries to escape.

SKINNY

(writer)

Dark comedy, 6 mins. Directed by Sölmunder Ísak. A young woman obsessed with calories takes the audience through her rigorous routine for staying in shape, which may include cannibalism and murder.

STAY

(writer)

Drama, 11 mins. Directed by Neill Prentice. Two young brothers break into a rural cabin, hoping to steal a bow and arrow from a man they believe to be the mythical creature Cupid.

A DAY AT THE OFFICE

(writer)

Comedy, 7 mins. Directed by Neill Prentice. When unknown terrorists threaten to blow up the office, hyper-masculine alpha-male boss Roger Hawthorne presents an unsuspecting intern with a bizarre choice: Kiss or die.

THE GAS

(writer)

Comedy, 2 mins. Directed by Alex Da Kouk. With minutes to spare before a deadly gas kills everyone, a couple must make a difficult choice.

(writer/director)

Comedy, 15 mins. A group of misfits join forces to rob a bank, only to discover they are all completely unqualified for the job.

Romantic comedy, 16 mins. Directed by Magnus Kr. Gudmundsson. A man enlists the help of his best female friend to help him prepare for the perfect date, a mission that quickly loses its charm.

Action, 7 mins. An agile thief breaks into a den of ninjas to retrieve a valuable necklace. Bullets, fists and parkour are sure to follow.

(writer/director)

Comedy, 3 mins. A birthday party goes out of control because of an unexpected complication. Hilarity ensues. So does violence.

STORM

(writer/director)

Drama, 14 mins. A dramatic and particularly stylised tale of an average man who has an accident that makes him doubt the very meaning of life.

ONE SHOT

(writer/director)

Comedy, 15 mins. Two nerdy friends decide to play Russian roulette to take care of their financial problems. Before long, the weight of their darkest secrets threatens to crush them both.
